When completing the art activity, please remember:

- Only use **acrylic paint** (water-based or gauche are not suitable).
- Please include the **artist's name and school** on the box below the animal so we can return the pieces to the correct school. This can be done in black text.
- Both sides should be painted over with a **clear gloss**, including around the edges. This will protect the work which will be out in the weather.
- Each cut-out has a numbered code on the back that corresponds with the painting templates to be used as a guide for the artists.



Completed animals need to be **delivered to East Gippsland Art Gallery, 2 Nicholson Street Bairnsdale by Tuesday 06 September** and we will display them outside on the grounds of the Gallery. On Wednesday 07 September 4.30pm we will be having a special event at the Gallery to commemorate Threatened Species Day. Everyone is welcome. Stay tuned for workshops and more info. All children and members of the public are welcome to attend this opening and entry is free.
